1           An act to require a metal detection system in all public middle and high schools in Kentucky  
2  
3                           **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**  
4  
5   Section 1: The purpose of this bill is to prevent students from getting hurt and possibly killed in school  
6   shootings. There has been 74 school shootings in the United States in the past 18 months.  
7  
8   Section 2: There are currently 1,183 public schools in the state of Kentucky. Some of these schools have  
9   metal detectors but they are not required to have them. Nine states in the US are required to have metal  
10   detectors. We propose that all public schools in Kentucky require door metal detectors.  
11  
12   Section 3: Funding for this bill will come from taxes and school funds. Taxes would cover the cost of 2  
13   detectors and the school would pay for any additional detectors needed.  
14  
15   Section 4: The penalty for the school not installing the metal detectors would be as follows: First Offense -  
16   Warning and a notice to comply within 90 days. Second Offense - \$5,000 fine with a notice to comply  
17   within 90 days. Third Offense - \$7,500 with a notice to comply within 60 days. After the third offense  
18   reinspection will occur every 30 days with a \$1,000 fine until installation.  
19  
20   Section 5: This bill will go into effect by July 1st of the 2016-17 school year.
