1 An act to enforce age restrictions on types of guns children use at shooting ranges.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section 1: This bill is meant to place age restrictions on the types of guns children can use based on the
6 gun's recoil and type of classification.
7
8 Section 2: This bill pertains to all shooting ranges, state and privately owned, throughout the Kentucky.
9
10 Section 3: Minors, under the age of 18, will not be allowed to use certain types or classifications of guns
11 (submachine, etc.) until of age. Also, the amount of recoil should be determined of all guns. The higher the
12 recoil, the older a child must be before handling the gun.
13
14 Section 4: Age restrictions based on gun recoil is as follows: 8 years to 10 years=Low recoil, 11-13
15 years=low to moderate recoil, 14-17 year=moderate recoil.

17 Section 5: There will be no cost to Kentucky taxpayers since this is strictly a regulation change.

19 Section 6: Penalties for failure to comply with this law would be a strike process. Shooting ranges that
20 allow exceptions will be warned with a threat of closure. Shooting ranges who simply refuses to implement
21 the new regulations will receive an immediate threat of closure.

23 Section 7: This bill should go into effect immediately and be implemented no later than January 10, 2015
