1	An act to hold a tax-free weekend in Kentucky once per year.
2	
3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4	
5	Section 1: Seventeen states hold a tax-free weekend once per year. People living in Kentucky will drive hours
6	to states such as Tennessee and Virginia to take part in tax-free weekends. This bill is intended to help
7	people save money on back-to-school shopping and also to boost the economy in Kentucky.
8	
9	Section 2: One of the busiest times to go shopping is late July and early August because of school starting.
10	Individuals will have the ability to go to a local store and be tax exempt. This will help parents buy new
11	clothes for their kids or for themselves if they unable to normally afford clothing.
12	
13	Section 3: Funding will come from the Kentucky Department of Revenue.
14	
15	Section 4: The Kentucky Department of Revenue will enforce this bill. All stores that sell clothing, electronics
16	(computers, hard drives, etc.), and health and beauty products will participate in this tax-free weekend.
17	
18	Section 5: The yearly tax-free weekend will be held during the last weekend in July before school begins.
19	
20	Section 6: This bill will go into effect July of the following year after passage.
