1 An act to place students in courses based upon academic performance.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will help to ensure that students are receiving the correct level of education based upon

6 their individual paces of learning. This bill is needed because research has shown that children need to learn

7 at their own pace. This will also ensure that children are not passed to another course when they did not

8 understand the previous one. To be required to retake a course the student will have to have below a 50%.

9 This will also work in the reverse so that if a student gets an 80% average or above on pre-assessment, they

10 will be allowed to pass to the next course.

12 Section 2: The instructor (or teacher) will enforce this upon his/her subject(s) he/she teaches.

14 Section 3: Offenses

15 First Offense: There will be a warning. The Kentucky Department of Education will distribute these warnings.

16 Second Offense: There will be a curriculum consultant that will observe the school in violation. This will

17 continue with each violation afterward.

19 Section 4: Students in special education that have Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) are reviewed annually

20 by law. They will continue to be evaluated annually and follow their IEPs.
