1 An act to require drivers to retake the drivers' test every other time they renew their license.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

5 Section 1: Currently Kentucky drivers only have to take their written drivers' exam once upon obtaining a
6 learner's permit. Studies indicate that drivers lose driving skills over time without accountability. This may
7 lead to an increase in wrecks and accidents.

9 Section 2: This bill will require drivers to take the written portion of the drivers' test every other time the
10 license is renewed (i.e., every ten years). At that time, a driver will be required to earn a score of at least 80%
11 on the test.

13 Section 3: The Kentucky Department of Transportation will promulgate regulations for how and in what
14 manner the written exam is administered, as well as training current personnel to proctor the exam.

16 Section 4: Drivers who fail to pass the exam will not be allowed to renew their license. They may retake the
17 test up to two times, after which there will be a 60 day waiting period to try again.

18 Current penalties for driving on a non-renewed license will apply to this legislation and include:

19 1st offense: warning

20 2nd offense: \$250 fine and/or up to 90 days in jail

21 3rd and subsequent offense: \$500 fine and/or up to one year in jail

23 Section 5: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky State Police and local law enforcement agencies in the
24 course of their regular traffic monitoring.

26 Section 6: This bill will take effect on July 1, 2015.
