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1 An act to require all Kentucky public schools to provide first aid courses to students.
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: This bill will require all Kentucky public middle school and high schools to provide mandatory first-
6 aid classes, apart from regular health classes.
7
8 Section 2: Many students between the age of 11 and 18 do not know how to properly provide medical
9 assistance. This class will teach students CPR, the Heimlich maneuver, basic first-aid, how to handle large
10 trauma, what to do when someone is having a panic attack, and other life-saving skills.

12 Section 3: Class instruction will be provided by a certified and licensed adult and/or certified nurse.
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14 Section 4: Funding for this bill will be provided by the Kentucky Lottery and its earnings, and 20% of KY civil
15 forfeiture.

17 Section 5: Non-compliance by any school will result in the following
18 1st offense the school will receive a fine of Three-Hundred dollars and students must take a make-up
19 class.
20 2nd offense the school will receive a fine of Seven-Hundred and Fifty dollars and all teachers will be
21 required to learn how to provide the class.
22 3rd offense the school will have a teacher sent over and a portion of the schools funding will be put
23 towards this class

25 Section 6: The Kentucky Department of Education will be responsible for the enforcement of this bill.
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27 Section 7: This bill will go into effect on August 1, 2016.
