1 An act to eliminate all electronic signs and billboards on any roads in Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Distracted drivers are the leading cause of wrecks in Kentucky
6 (Ex: drinking, cell phones, babies, etc.)

8 Section 2: Every year, 14 million people drive 1.7 trillion miles. We could eliminate a lot of wrecks among
9 these 14 million people. There are nearly 500,000 large and small billboards within eyesight of the highways,
10 freeways and local streets in the United States.

12 Section 3: Signtronix says their LED outdoor full color signs are "...the most eye-catching...signs you can
13 have for your business."
14 This is proof that it will draw your attention, which may be what they want, but can cause distracted drivers
15 (the leading cause of wrecks in Kentucky)

17 Section 4: It would not cost the U.S. Department of Labor's Employment Standards Administration any
18 additional money. It would actually save electric/billboards companies an average of \$2500 every month.

20 Section 5: This bill will be put into action a year after it has been passed on January 1st.
