- 1 An act to require EpiPens in all classrooms in schools where students have life threatening allergies.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: All classrooms with students that have life threatening allergies will be required to have an EpiPen
- 6 available for the child.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: The EpiPens cost around \$400-\$500. Insurance will cover two EpiPens for the child after that the
- 9 government will assist paying for the EpiPens that are needed for the child.
- 10
- 11 Section 3: A \$100 fine is given to anyone that misuses an EpiPen. Parents and children will need to be
- 12 trained by their family doctor in the steps to use an EpiPen. Teachers will receive training from the parents
- 13 of their student that has a life threatening allergy. Teachers may receive additional training on their own.
- 14
- 15 Section 4: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2016.
