1                   An act to reduce taxes for organic farmers to make organic foods affordable.

3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5   Section 1: This bill will give organic food farmers a tax break on items that they need to grow their food to  
6   organic food standards, including fertilization methods.

7  
8   Section 2: Local restaurants and markets seek local purchase of organic food versus depending on corporate  
9   contracts to ship it in.

10  
11   Section 3: With better access to organic foods, the chances of cancer, obesity and other tragic diseases will  
12   decrease.

13  
14   Section 4: The funding for the program will come from grants through the USDA and the Organic Association  
15   of Kentucky (OAK).

16  
17   Section 5: This bill will be enacted 1 year after it is passed.
