An act to require all waste removal companies to provide recycling service to their customers.

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Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

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Section 1: This bill proposes that all waste removal companies will be required to provide recycling service to all of their customers at no extra cost. Waste removal companies will provide door to door pick up for recycling items to Kentucky residents.

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Section 2: This bill will affect all waste collection companies servicing Kentucky residents and the residents of Kentucky receiving waste removal service. This will lower the amount of trash filling our landfills and protect the environment.

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Section 3: The Kentucky Energy and Environmental Cabinet will enforce this law through the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection under the Division of Waste Management. The waste removal companies will be required to provide recycling to all of their customers. If they do not, failure to comply will result in the following consequences:

- 17 First Offense: Any waste removal company that does not provide recycling service to their customers by
- January 1, 2017 will be fined \$1.00 for each customer not receiving service and will have 6 months to
- 19 provide the service to all of their customers.
- Second Offense: Companies will be fined \$2.00 for each customer not receiving service and will have 6 months to provide the service to all of their customers.
- Third Offense: Companies will be fined \$3.00 for each customer not receiving service and will have 6
- 23 months to provide the service to all of their customers. (Every offense thereafter will be charged a rate of
- \$10 per customer not receiving service until all customers are receiving service.)

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Section 4: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2017. This bill would not require any funding by the government through tax dollars.
