1 2	An act to distribute state general funds equally across Kentucky for mental health treatment, addiction treatment and community care support.
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4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
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6	Section 1: State General Funds for mental health treatment, addiction treatment, and community care
7	support are not being given out evenly to the different regions of Kentucky. This act requires those funds to
8	be divided evenly, per capita (for each person) across the state. For example, Northern Kentucky has
9	10.16% of Kentucky's population but receives only 8.16% of these funds. Northern Kentucky received under
10	\$2.4 million dollars of these funds in 2013. This is approximately \$5.00 less per person than any other
11	region in Kentucky. Northern Kentucky urgently needs this money to fight a serious heroin epidemic. If this
12	epidemic spreads, in a similar force, to other areas of Kentucky, other regions would also benefit from this
13	act, by having an equal share of this funding.
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15 16	Section 2: Northern Kentucky is the epicenter of a growing heroin epidemic in the state. Kentucky ranks
17	third in the nation for overdose deaths. Over 1000 people died from drug overdoses in Kentucky in 2013, and nearly half of those deaths were in Northern Kentucky. Fifty-four percent (54%) of those Northern
18	Kentucky deaths were heroin-related, as compared to 32% state-wide. The number of overdose cases at
19	Northern Kentucky hospitals increased by over 77% in 2012 and, in 2013, heroin cases nearly doubled
20	those in 2012.
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22	Section 3: The heroin epidemic is straining medical, judicial and law enforcement budgets. Heroin is highly
23	addictive and effects people of all ages, rich and poor. Northern Kentucky can only afford to give treatment
24	to 25% of substance abusers who are looking for help. If Northern Kentucky does not slow down this
25	epidemic, it may spread like a wildfire all over the state, effecting Kentucky's economy and destroying many
26	more lives.
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28	Section 4: This act requires existing funds to be redistributed equally at no extra cost to taxpayers.
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30	Section 5: This act will go into effect ninety (90) days following passage.
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32	Definition: Per capita – for each person. This means that the fund distribution will be based on the
33	population in a region. From region to region, the same amount of money per person will be provided.
