- 1 An act of the Kentucky government to give the options for individuals at age 35 and every ten years
- 2 afterwards to receive a free blood screening for cancer.

- 4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 5
- 6 Section 1: Many people in Kentucky die every year from cancer. This bill would give individuals the option to
- 7 have a free blood test. This bill could save lives. The individual can not have two free blood tests within 10
- 8 years. This is not mandatory.
- 9
- 10 Section 2: If you would prefer to get the blood test, then you may go to any Kentucky hospital. Any certified
- 11 doctor can perform the blood test. Depending on the test, the results will back between 24 hours and a
- 12 week.

- 14 Section 3: The blood tests will be paid with taxes. The amount is sales tax is increasing one percent. The
- 15 sales tax will be seven percent instead of six percent. The cost of the blood tests ranges to 300 to 5,000
- 16 dollars.

- 18 Section 4: This bill will come into effect January 1, 2016
