1           An act to require citizens convicted of animal abuse be restricted from future animal ownership.  
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3                           **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**  
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5   Section 1: All Kentucky residents who have been convicted of animal abuse will be restricted from owning or  
6   adopting animals.  
7  
8   Section 2: A state-wide database will be created to register all people who have been convicted of animal  
9   abuse. This database will include the person's name, classification of their crime, details about fines or  
10   imprisonments, and any other important information.  
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12   Section 3: Registered offenders with more than 30 days imprisonment, and more than a \$500 fine will never  
13   again be allowed to own an animal. Convicted abusers with a minor infraction (a sentence of less than 30  
14   days or a \$500 fine) will be allowed to own an animal. Minor offenders who are allowed to own or adopt an  
15   animal must complete mandatory community service at a pet shelter for 6 months prior to the purchase or  
16   adoption. Verification of completion will be submitted by a manager of the shelter.  
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18   Section 4: Each county will be responsible for creating a database with  
19   communication between counties.  
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21   Section 5: Money from the General Fund will be allocated to each county to help  
22   set up the data base. All fines collected will go into the General Fund.  
23  
24   Section 6: This program will go into effect one year from date of passage.
