1 An act to require that all products considered harmful if swallowed include poison control center contact  
2 information on the label.  
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: In order to prevent unnecessary emergency room visits or waste time in an emergency situation,  
7 our bill would require a poison control center's number to be provided on all products considered harmful if  
8 swallowed.  
9

10 Section 2: This bill would require very little funding. The dollar amount would fall back to the company  
11 making the product. It will be there responsibility to add the number to their already existing label for the  
12 product.  
13

14 Section 3: Quality control employees, who regulate the labels of cleaning products to ensure all ingredients  
15 and the proper warnings are listed, will check to see that this bill is being enforced.  
16

17 Section 4: Any company not listing the contact information for the poison control center on their labels will  
18 receive a warning for the first offense and a \$500.00 fine thereafter.  
19

20 Section 5: This bill will go into effect on December 10, 2015.
