- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: This bill will require the State of Kentucky to provide credits to schools that participate in a
- 6 recycling program.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: These credits will go towards educational needs such as books, technology, and field trips. Credits
- 9 will equal 10 cents per one pound of recycling.
- 10
- 11 Section 3: Schools will NOT be required to recycle.
- 12
- 13 Section 4: The Department of Education and respective school districts' financial managers will work
- 14 together to regulate and enforce this bill.
- 15
- 16 Section 5: This bill will go into effect at the beginning of the 2015/16 school year.
