- 5 Section 1: This bill would require a 4.5% increase in state issued property taxes, resulting in free health care
- 6 for all Kentucky citizens.

- 8 Section 2: This bill would raise property taxes by 4.5%. This money will then be used to give citizens free
- 9 healthcare.

- 11 Section 3: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Revenue Cabinet.

- 13 Section 4: This bill will be funded by the citizens of Kentucky by paying taxes to the state government.

- 15 Section 5: This bill will take effect on July 1st, 2015.
