An act to require all competitive and organized sports teams with athletes ages 11 and older to require a

2 sports physical to participate in the sport. 3 4 Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky 5 6 Section 1: Many middle schools and middle school aged sports teams do not require a sports physial. This 7 can be dangerous for many people who have a medical condition. The KHSAA bylaws state that any team 8 affiliated with their organization must require each student trying for a place as a participant on the sports 9 team or event to have a sports physical to participate. Not all teams are require to follow these bylaws. For 10 example, neighborhood swim teams are not required to follow these rules. 11 12 Section 2: A sports physical checks on the medical history such as past injuries, past illnesses, illnesses in 13 your family ect. During a sports physical, healthcare professionals records the athlete's heights and weight, 14 they check blood pressure and pulse, and the athlete's vision, lungs, heart, abdomen, ears, nose, and throat 15 are evaluated. Additionally, the athlete's posture, joints, strength, and flexibility are assessed as well. 16 One specific illness that can show up during a sports physical is female athlete triad. There are three 17 conditions that make up the female athlete triad: disordered eating, amenorrhea, and osteoporosis. This 18 illness can consist of one, two, or all three conditions. In addition, there are two are other illness that are often detected during these physicals. Asthma is a lung disease that causes the infected to have trouble 19 20 breathing and can cause lack of oxygen in the lungs. Epilepsy is a brain disorder where the person will loose 21 consciousness for no reason or have repeated seizures. 22

23 Section 3: The bill will have no cost.24

Section 4: The first penalty will be a fine of \$50. The second offense will be a fine of \$150, and the third
offense will result in the suspension of the acting coach for one full season. The official coach will submit all
player physicals to the health department at least (2) weeks prior to the first practice.

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29 Section 5: This bill will go into effect in the 2015-2016 school year.
