An act to ban smoking in enclosed cars with minors present.

**Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

Section 1: This bill would ban the use of smoking tobacco in enclosed vehicles with minors present.

Section 2: Smoking in a enclosed vehicle is a danger to anyone, but especially to children and pregnant women.

Section 3: Smoking in enclosed spaces without a window down could be considered child abuse.

Section 4: The Local or State Police would carry out the initial complaint. Failure to comply would then involve child protective services.

Section 5: Consequences for non-compliance:

\*1st offense: Warning and information containing the dangers of second hand smoke would be mailed to their home.

\*2nd offense: \$100 fine and appear in court

\*3rd offense: \$150 fine and a two hour smoking tobacco prevention class would be required once a week for three months.

Section 6: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2015.
