1 An act to limit the amount of products produced with non-renewable energy that a Kentucky-based store
2 can have in inventory at any given time.
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: All Kentucky-based stores with over 20 employees that sell products made with non-renewable
7 energies in quantities over 100 will refrain from purchasing any more of that product until less than 1/3 of
8 the original stock remains.
9

10 Section 2: Only about 4.25% of energies used in Kentucky are renewable. This bill will encourage companies
11 to sell products made with renewable energies. This will benefit the environment, since more stores will be
12 selling eco-friendly product. This will also encourage consumers to use eco-friendly products.
13

14 Section 3: Products must be registered as being made with renewable energy. All other products will be
15 counted as non-renewable under this bill. A volunteer committee will authorize the products and also inspect
16 the inventory and purchases of stores for the purposes of this law.
17

18 Section 4: This bill will be funded through taxes generated from the Kentucky Business Investment (KBI),
19 which will be placed in a fund to pay the expenses of the committee.

21 Section 5: Should a store fail to follow this law, they receive the following penalties based on the revenue of
22 the store:
23

24 First offense: Removal of stock and a fine not exceeding \$100.

25 Second offense: Removal of stock and a fine not exceeding \$500.

26 Third and onwards offense: Removal of business license for a length of 10 months, and a fine not exceeding
27 \$1000.
28

29 Section 6: This bill will take effect January 1, 2016, in order to allow stores to prepare for it.
