1           An act to require all students attending Kentucky public schools to be randomly drug tested.

2  
3                           **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4  
5   Section 1: The purpose of this bill is to include all middle schools just athletes in Kentucky public schools  
6 randomly be drug tested to prevent students from doing drugs.

8   Section 2: In 2012 in a 30-day use survey 14.3% of middle school age students in the stae of Kentucky had  
9 used marijuana, 0.8% used cocaine or crack and 0.9% used uppers/speed.

10  
11   Section 3: The local Board of Educations will oversee this process by putting every middle school student in  
12 the system in a random selection pool by grade levels (6th, 7th, 8th) then every two months 10-15 students  
13 will be randomly selected out of each pool.

14  
15   Section 4: The goal of this bill is to prevent all students from doing drugs.

16  
17   Section 5: If the drug results come back positive for any student, that student will be sent to a drug  
18 counseling class with their parents for a month. If there is a second offense that student will be sent to drug  
19 counseling class with their parents plus 30 days in a juvenile detention center.

20  
21   Section 6: This bill will go into effect on June 1, 2015.
