1 2	An act to make it illegal to test products on animals.
3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4 5 6 7	Section 1: Our bill is to prohibit testing of products on animals due to the harmful effect it has on its test subjects. There is a law about animal abuse in homes, and we feel that there should be a law prohibiting abuse on animals for companies, as well.
8 9 10 11 12	Section 2: Due to the crippling effects imposed on animals, this bill will protect animals from abuses resulting brain damage, the implementation of electrodes into the brain, other painful and invasive procedures, and even death.
13 14 15 16	Section 3: This bill will obviously effect animals. A few well-known companies who test on animals are: Axe cologne, Huggies, Alcon labs, Kleenex, Post-Its, and Windex. It will also affect companies who use the information gathered from animals testing.
17 18 19	Section 4: The enforcement will be managed by the CLIA or Clinical Laboratory Improvement Inspectors to confirm compliance, which will be conducted randomly.
20 21	Section 5: No additional costs will be imposed, just the recompense from laboratory inspections.
22 23 24	Section 6: Non-compliance will result in a \$25,000 fine per violation. Upon the third cited violation, companies will be shut down until compliance is met.
25	Section 7: This bill will go into effect on January of 2016.
