An act to require all schools to place epi-pen dispensers on each floor of the school building.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: In addition to every school being required to keep epi-pen auto injectors on each floor, each school will also be required to maintain one epi-pen to a twenty-five student ratio.

Section 2: Students in both public and private schools over the age of twelve with a prescription from a physician will be permitted to carry their personal epi-pen with them during school hours, so that in case of an emergency allergic reaction, the student may self inject.

Section 3: Schools, public and private, with a student/teacher ration of less than twenty-eight to one will be eligible for government financial assistance.

Section 4: If a school is found not to be in compliance by their district superintendent during annual violation checks, all schools will pay a fine up to %1,500 per code violation.

Section 5: This bill will go into effect at the beginning of the 2015–2016 school year.
