- 1 An act to allow "non-voting" student representation on SBDM councils

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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- 5 Section 1: Students currently lack a voice when it comes to Site Based Decision Making Councils (SBDM).
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- 7 Section 2: This bill would require public schools (with grades 5 and up) to actively seek student applicants to
- 8 be "non-voting" members of their SBDM councils. Schools may select 1 (minimum) or 2 (maximum) students.
- 9
- 10 Section 3: Interested students would complete an application, including a writing prompt on why they want
- 11 to serve. Applications should include 1-2 teacher referrals. Criteria should include the following: A/B average,
- 12 no office referrals, proof of extracurricular activities.

- 14 Section 4: If no students apply, schools must show proof that they adequately advertised the position. This
- 15 must be done to comply with the law. If passed, this bill will take affect in the 2015-2016 school year.
