1 An act to increase the number of recycling bins used in Kentucky public schools.

2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This bill will require public schools with more than 550 students to place at least 20 recycling bins
6 in the school. If a school does not have that many students, there will be a ratio of 1 recycling bin to every
7 10 students.

9 Section 2: This bill applies only to public schools, therefore, no private schools and homeschools are required
10 to follow this bill.

11
12 Section 3: The first penalty for public schools to not follow this bill will be that the funding provided by the
13 state would be cut in half one year. If the bill isn't followed after a one year period, that school will receive no
14 state funding until they are in compliance.

15
16 Section 4: This bill will go into effect on January 3, 2016.
