Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

An act to restore Kentucky's environments by focusing on littering laws.

Section 1: 17% of Kentucky's households do not participate in trash collection. This problem has led to Kentucky's interstates suffering to a littering problem. Garbage lines our major interstates causing many negative environmental effects.

If this bill is passed it will require thirty monitored highway cameras to be placed at different mile markers on popular traveled and heavily littered Kentucky interstate highways to observe and eventually control the litter.

Section 2: The environment and wildlife is important part of Kentucky. 47% percent of Kentucky is covered in forest. The state is also home to thirty-seven endangered animal species. This bill will help create a better environment for those animals to live and roam for many years to come.

Section 4: The camera used will be the Brinno Bcc100 Hd time-lapse construction camera bundle. The price of the cameras is \$269.99. If this bill is passed it would cost \$8099.70 for all thirty cameras which will be installed by the Kentucky State Police.
