1 An act to promote healing vs. punishment for kids who fail drug tests.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This proposal will require a counselor to provide one-on-one counseling and follow-ups for
6 students who fail any given drug test during the school semester.
7
8 Section 2: Sessions will be fifty minutes long and include two to six sessions; the required amount of
9 sessions will be determined by the schools psychologist. Follow-ups will be held until the end of the school
10 year by the counselor.

12 Section 3: counseling sessions will be held by the schools psychologist, while the follow-ups will be done by
13 the schools counselor.
