1 2	An act to encourage higher STEM education and jobs for a bright Kentucky future.
2 3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Section 1: This bill will allow interested Kentucky 9th graders to participate in a program that upon completion of high school will also award a Kentucky State Associates Degree (KSAD) in a certified STEM field. Current tracks are, but are not limited to, Biomedical Sciences, Mechanical/Electrical Engineering, and Computer Science. If the student doesn't meet the requirements for receiving the KSAD they will not be eligible for any further benefits from the program.
11 12 13 14 15	Section 2: After obtaining the KSAD the students then have the ability to obtain an on the job Bachelors Degree in whichever STEM field they have chosen from an accredited university located in the state of Kentucky. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in internships and apprenticeships if they choose to go to school for their Bachelors Degree instead of on the job training.
15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23	 Section 3: A. The KSAD will be a new program only valid in the state of Kentucky. To further incentivise recipients to stay, the on the job Bachelor's Degree will only be subsidized if the student remains in Kentucky for the duration of the program. By allowing students to build their ties to the state of Kentucky, we will be able to become a leader in infrastructure development, advanced medicine, and will be able to serve as an example to the rest of the nation on the value of education. B. In order to attain the KSAD, each student must hold and maintain at least a 3.5 GPA.
24 25 26 27 28	Section 4: Each student who completes the program to get the KSAD and the on job Bachelor's degree along with holding a job (or obtaining a higher degree) in the state of Kentucky for eight (8) years will receive a pension and take part in a tenure type system. Along with working in the Commonwealth for eight years, the student will also need to meet certain benchmarks to be set forthwith by the appropriate agencies.
29 30 31 32	Section 5: The total funds requested for this program are equal to the per student expenditure per year for all students in the program (if all 53,000 8th graders join the program, the sum will equal: \$202,963,500), plus a discretionary supplemental fund not to exceed \$50,000,000.
33 34 35	Section 6: The actions described herein will be executed by a special committee who will determine the appropriate agencies to be involved, as well as a timeline for rollout. This committee will be formed upon passage of this bill. The four authors shall be granted positions on the committee.
