An act to purge outdated bills from Kentucky's body of laws

**Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

Section 1: The Congressional Body of Kentucky shall meet in a Joint Session every year to discuss and repeal outdated and/or antiquated bills going in cycles of 2 score(40 years) from the first law ever passed. For example, as the first law ever passed in Kentucky was in 1792, the first meeting to de-clutter and cleanse Kentucky's body of laws will discuss laws passed in the years 1792, 1832, 1872, 1912, 1952, 1992 (+40 each time). The next year, the Congress will do the same for the years 1793, 1833, 1873, 1913, 1953, and 1993. This cycle allows the Congress to discuss and repeal laws from 6 hand-picked years in the past.

Section 2: A supermajority is required to repeal such bills.

Section 3: The bills reviewed shall not include laws pertaining to street names.

Section 4: The Congress shall meet each year in March for the month to discuss and repeal laws brought into question.

Section 5: This will be enacted January 1, 2016.
