1 An act to require high school physical education courses to educate students on self defense
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: This bill will require all public high schools in Kentucky to provide instruction to students enrolled
6 in a Physical Education on basic self-defense skills through a certified instructor or a recognized self-defense
7 curriculum.
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9 Section 2: Each school's Site-Based Decision Making council will determine the method of instruction for
10 their particular school.
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12 Section 3: Funding for this instruction will come from the school's operating budget. Site-based Decision
13 Making councils will decide how to fund the instruction based on curriculum and teacher training needs.

15 Section 4: The bill will go into effect one year after passage to allow schools time to acquire curriculum and
16 certify teachers in self-defense training.
