An act to require all public school districts in the state of Kentucky to drug test public school employees.

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## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

4 5 Section 1: The Kentucky Department of Education shall require all public school districts in the state of 6 Kentucky to drug test public school employees. Drug testing procedures will be in faculty and staff contracts. 7 By signing the contract, the employee acknowledges and agrees to random drug screening. Refusal to sign 8 the contract voids employment. Potential public school employee candidates and current public school 9 employees will be required to go to a drug testing facility that has a contract with the school district. School 10 districts will be provided funding by federal grants. It will be the Kentucky Department of Education's 11 responsibility to set up the grants 12

Section 2: The Department of Transportation mandates that people seeking commercial driver's license must be tested for the following 5 categories of drugs: cannobinoids, cocaine, amphetamines, opiates, and phencyclidine known as the SAMHSA 5. The same testing system will be required by the Department of Education.

Section 3: A random drug testing schedule will be devised by the drug testing facility. This schedule will include all employees of the school district. Upon being hired, new employees will be required to complete drug testing. Following hiring, all employees will be subject to drug testing at another point in the school year. Employees will be expected to go in for drug testing immediately after receiving notice of selection.

23 Section 4: This bill will go into effect for the 2015–16 school year.
