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1 An act to limit the required years certain classes a student must take by using a standardized placement test
2 to determine his/her eligibility to skip a course.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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6 Section 1: This bill allows students who have taken a required course for at least 2 years to be eligible to
7 take a placement test which will determine whether or not they can skip the class the following school year.
8

9 Section 2: This bill would allow the student's schedule to better fit his/her own needs. If a student's score
10 meets a set benchmark, they will not be required to take the course the following school year. This would
11 allow the student to focus more on classes that would benefit more to his/her academic performance,
12 possible college major, specialized preference, etc.

14 Section 3: Students would still receive full credit for completing the course, just as they would if they took
15 the course the required amount of years.

17 Section 4: This bill would allow students to excel in courses they may have previously struggled in. Not every
18 student is the same. Some students need more help in certain subject areas and less in others.

20 Section 5: Students who meet benchmarks in certain subjects will be required to take another placement test
21 at the end of the school year in which they are not required to take the course to ensure their knowledge of
22 said subject is adequate.

24 Section 6: This bill will be enacted at the beginning of the next school year.
