1 An act to require Kentucky colleges to give equal consideration to applicants in the area of academics,
2 leadership, standardized testing, and teacher recommendation.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: This bill will provide a more equitable opportunity to those student's who do not test well on the
7 standardized assessments and cause an influx of out of state student's to attend Kentucky universities and
8 colleges.

10 Section 2: By adopting this bill more student's will be considered for in state scholarships based on their
11 overall performance and not on the standardized assessment allowing more student to be able to afford the
12 tuition. This will also provide an increased enrollment for Kentucky schools due to the increased number of
13 out of state student's attending our universities/colleges.

15 Section 3: This bill will not cause an increase of tuition in the state of Ky, but it will cause an increase of
16 enrollment and will therefore increase funds to the universities/colleges.

17
18 Section 4: This bill will enacted in the fall of 2015.
