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1 An act to mandate a guaranteed curriculum; including guidelines for educating students on pregnancy
2 prevention and the stresses of having a child in high school.

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4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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6 Section 1: This guaranteed curriculum will become mandatory to graduate high school. In this class, students
7 will be taught many important things necessary to inform them on how to practice safe intercourse, and also
8 the consequences of life, pre and post childbirth.

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10 Section 2: It is mandatory that each of these areas are covered within this class, however, it will be under the
11 discretion of each local Board of Education to have control over the specifics of this curriculum. Suggested
12 topics covered within these areas are: practices of safe sex, contraceptives, sexually transmitted diseases,
13 internal and external biological changes, safe environments for a healthy pregnancy, and also the affect on
14 students of having a child in high school.

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16 Section 3: Since this class will be required for all public schools, government funding will be allotted to each
17 school. This funding will provide schools with necessary materials and salaries (if needed) for new teachers.
18 Because the criteria for this class falls under the certification of teachers of Physical Education and Healthy,
19 new teachers will not be required to teach this class; instead, current teachers in these fields will be given
20 curriculum guides, issued by their local Board of Education. Since this is a guaranteed curriculum, it may be
21 interjected into another class, eliminating the need for developing a new class. However, the teacher of the
22 course is responsible for the specific curriculum, therefore they will decide upon the materials required to
23 accurately teach each objective/standard.

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25 Section 4: This bill will go into effect the start of the 2016-2017 school year to ensure that the teachers are
26 well prepared and familiar with the curriculum.
