1 An act to ban the use of electronic cigarettes within enclosed workpla	ces in Kentucky co	ounties.

An act to ban the use of electronic cigarettes within enclosed workplaces in Kentucky counties.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill prohibits smoking in enclosed workplaces and public places, including restaurants, bars, gaming facilities, private clubs, and hotels/motels, and within 15' of entrances/windows of smoke-free buildings.

Section 2: As of now, November 20, 2014, the legislation addressing penalties for disregarding the smoking law states, "The official in charge of public building shall post a conspicuous sign that reads "Smoking Is Prohibited By State Law Except In Designated Smoking Areas" or other similar language. A person who smokes in a nonsmoking area commits a Class B infraction punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 for the first offense which becomes a Class A infraction punishable by a fine of up to \$10,000 if the person has three previous violations within the preceding 12 months. Also the person may be removed by the official in charge of the public building for failing to refrain from smoking when asked to do so."

Section 3: This bill will put in place the same laws against electronic cigarettes as the ones currently in place against regular cigarettes.

Section 4: Any violations of electronic cigarette laws will result in the following penalties for the violator:

1st Offense: \$1,000 fine 2nd Offense: \$2,500 3rd Offense: \$2,500

4th Offense or any offense occurring thereafter: \$10,000 fine

Section 5: There will be no funding required for this bill.

Section 6: This law will be enforced by the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services.

Section 7: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2016.
