2	supplements in show stock at the Ky State Fair.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

6 Section 1: This Bill will impose a penalty on either the Grand or Reserve Grand Champion winner if they are
7 found guilty of using body modification methods or illegal medications and supplements on any of the four
8 species shown at the Kentucky State Fair (Cattle, Sheep, Goats, and Hogs).

Section 2: The Showman will be found guilty of using body modification methods or illegal medications after
 the animal has been autopsied, and the examiner has found evidence.

Section 3:The penalty system is as follows. Anyone found guilty of using body modification methods or illegal medications in Sheep, Goats, or Hogs will be fines \$1,000 and will be banned form entering any Kentucky State Fair Livestock Show. Anyone found guilty of using body modification methods or illegal medications in cattle will be fined \$2,000 and banned from entering any Kentucky State Fair Livestock Show. In addition to the fines, the Showman will forfeit his or her recently earned title and it will be given to the showman who placed the next highest after the Grand and/or the Reserve Grand Champions. The showman will also forfeit all earnings he or she has won and the money will be evenly divided between each class winner.

Section 4: This law would help deter showmen from brutally and inhumanely modifying the bodies of their
 livestock, as well as using illegal medications and supplements to increase the muscle mass of the animal
 which also taint the meat, making it not suitable for human consumption

Section 5: This bill would not require any funding.

27 Section 6: This bill will go into effect as of January 1, 2015.
