An act to terminate the parental rights of a rapist.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill will prevent a convicted rapist from having any parental or visitation rights with the child conceived by the rape.

Section 2: In order for the custody of the child to be eligible for termination, the rapist must be convicted of the crime. The Child Protection Agency (CPA) will contact the guardian of said child if there has been a conviction made and inform them that the parental rights of the rapist have been terminated. According to Kentucky Revised Statues 403.322, the guardian may apply for child support and the convicted person is forced by law to pay.

Section 3: The Commonwealth of Kentucky recognizes that victims of sexual assault, and the children that result from them, may suffer from severe emotional or physical trauma if contact is continued between them and the perpetrator.

Section 4: This bill will be enforced by the Child Protection Agency.

Section5: This bill will be put into effect for any child conceived by rape as of January 1st, 2015.
