1 An act to require all public high school bathrooms to be equipped with a cigarette specific smoke detector.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Teenagers across Kentucky are affected directly as well as indirectly by the smoke of cigarettes
6 and illegal substances. Although smoking is not permitted on high school grounds, teenagers continue to
7 break this code of conduct on a regular basis.

9 Section 2: The purpose of this bill is to lessen the first and second hand smoke by requiring cigarette
10 sensitive smoke detectors in all public high school bathrooms. These high degree smoke detectors will send a
11 text message to an administrator alerting them of the smoking of a cigarette, so an alarm will not disrupt
12 the school day.

14 Section 3: This will be enforced through high school inspector's criteria when they come monthly. If the
15 schools are unqualified then they will have until the next inspection to meet the regulation. If they still refuse
16 to place the detectors after several offenses then the school can risk potential consequences.

18 Section 4: This bill will go into effect at the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year.
