1	An act to require one ambulance at all high school sporting events in Kentucky.
2 3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6 7	Section 1: This bill is to require at least one ambulance at all high school sporting events due to high risk of injuries during athletic events.
8 9	Section 2: Presently, ambulances are typically only at Varsity football games. With the amount of injuries, and in serious cases death, the ambulances will be required to be present at all athletic events.
10 11 12 13 14	Section 3: Sports injuries in adolescents account for nearly 40 percent of all sports injuries in hospitals. The rate of the severity of the injury increases as the age of the child increases. Whether the injury is internal or external, in the case of an emergency, the ambulance must be present.
15 16 17 18 19	Section 4:The present cost to have to an Emergency Medical Service (EMS) at a game ranges anywhere from\$400-\$1200. This cost depends on the ambulance company that you are using, how far the ambulance has to travel to get to the location and how long they must be present. The cost will be paid from the school's yearly allotted budget for athletics.
20 21 22 23	Section 5: The punishment for not having an ambulance present the first time would be a \$500 fine, second time offenders is a \$1,000 fine, repeated offenses after the second time while be handed to KHSAA for the consequence to be decided.
24	Section 6: This bill will go into effect January 1 the year after it's passed.
