An act to provide student facilitators to ELL students.
Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
Section 1: According to the Kentucky Department of Education, there is a critical shortage of Spanish
language/ESL teachers in KY. The United States Department of Education has also designated world
language and ESL as two of several teacher shortage areas. This act would provide ELL
primary/intermediate/middle school students with a high school student volunteer to act as an English
language facilitator.
Section 2: Elementary/intermediate/middle school principals or guidance counselors would collect names of
students needing a student facilitator and refer those names to the secondary world language department
closest to their school. Secondary world language teachers would approve interested high school students
wanting to serve as facilitators. Student facilitators would be required to have a minimum of two years of
the world language needed. Student facilitators would service ELL students on a bi-weekly basis and report
once a week to their world language supervising teachers. Each school district would provide transportation for high school student facilitators.
Section 3: High school students in world language classes at level 3 or higher (Example: Spanish III or French
III) would have the option to earn independent study credit OR community service hours while serving as
facilitators for younger ELL students. This volunteer service would benefit high schools that do not offer
level 3 or higher world language classes by allowing students to earn independent study credit for their
service time.

Section 4: This act would not apply to home-schooled students.
