1	An act to allow non-violent criminals to trade jail sentence for military service.
2 3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6 7	Section 1: This bill proposes to allow non-violent criminals the option to trade jail sentencing for military service equal to 50% of original jail sentence. The jail sentence must exceed one year to be eligible.
8 9 10 11	Section 2: Criminals for this option must attain or have already attained a GED. This program will coincide with the current National Guards GED Plus Program. This is needed to meet all requirements of the current military standard acceptance rubric.
12 13 14	Section 3: Criminals who participate in this program will receive 50% median pay. They will also have automatic deductions for any needed monetary payments (i.e. fines, alimony, or child support).
15 16 17	Section 4: There will be no offenses for non-participation in this program. The punishment of these criminals will be based on said misconduct. Available disciplinary actions include removal from program.
18 19 20 21	Section 5: People who participate in this program will be stationed in Kentucky's National Guard. Supervisors will be assigned to watch over these criminals. These supervisors will be previously stationed soldiers who have volunteered for this position. If no one volunteers, someone will be assigned.

2122 Section 6: This bill will go into effect 6 months after passage.
