| 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 | Section 1: The Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services shall require all potential foster parents in the state of Kentucky to submit to a drug test prior to receiving guardianship of a child. Drug testing procedures will be included in all foster parents paperwork. By signing the adoption/foster agreement the parent acknowledges and agrees to random drug screening. Refusal to sign the contract voids the foster parent guardianship. Potential and current foster parents will be required to go to a drug testing facility that has a contract with the state of Kentucky. Funding will be provided by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services. |
| 14 15 16 17 18 | Section 2: The Department of Transportation mandates that people seeking commercial driver's license must be tested for the following 5 categories of drugs: cannobinoids, cocaine, amphetamines, opiates, and phencyclidine known as the SAMHSA 5. The same testing system will be required when taking guardianship of a child. The Cabinet for Health and Family Services should mandate this drug test for all foster parents. |
| 19 20 21 22 23 | Section 3: A random drug testing schedule will be devised by the drug testing facility. This schedule will include all current foster parents and perspective foster parents. Upon being selected new foster parents will be required to complete drug testing. Following placement all foster parents will be subject to drug testing at another point in the calendar year. Parents will be expected to go in for drug testing within three days of receiving notice of selection. |
