4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

7 Section 1: Currently Kentucky is one of the only four states that never restore voting rights to those who
8 commit a felony. By not allowing these individuals to vote we are fully engaging them into a community.

10 Section 2: This would enable persons who have committed a felony after 2016 to be eligible for voting two
11 years after the completion of their parole or probation.

13 Section 3: If a judge feels the right to vote has not been earned by an individual then the right may not be
14 given.

16 Section 4: This bill requires no funding.

18 Section 5: This bill will go into effect in 2016.
