3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

5	Section 1: The unemployment rate in Kentucky is currently 7.4%, compared to the national unemployment
6	rate of 5.9%. In order to stabilize Kentucky's economy and secure a prosperous future for the
7	commonwealth, we need to decrease our state's unemployment rate. To do this, we propose to provide each
8	school district in the state of Kentucky with a career educator so that students are better equipped to
