1 An act to ease the transition from coal power to renewable energy

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Willing workers directly involved in the mining and extraction of coal within the state of Kentucky
6 will be instructed and trained in the maintenance and manufacture of renewable energy technologies such as
7 solar, wind, hydroelectric, etc.
8
9 Section 2: Those employed by the coal industry who are not directly involved in mining coal and are willing to
10 be trained will be trained for their equivalent jobs within the renewables industry.
11
12 Section 3: As incentive, 15% of an individual’s state taxes will be nullified while said individual participates in
13 training.
14
15 Section 4: The funds for training these employees will sum to no more than 0.75% of the state budget.
16
17 Section 5: Those instructing these individuals must know how to properly implement and maintain renewable
18 energy resources and technologies such as wind power, solar power, hydroelectric power, and nuclear
19 power.
20
21 Section 6: This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2016.
