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1 An act to designate teachers as security officers within the school.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: This Bill would allow schools to designate teachers throughout the school to assume the role of
6 Security Officers, who would be allowed to conceal a weapon with training. This Bill would not be for every
7 teacher to carry a weapon. This could possibly save lives in times of crisis. Many schools today cannot afford
8 to have a full time security officer.

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10 Section 2: A concealed deadly weapon could range from a blackjack to a gun depending on teacher’s training.
11 A security officer monitors sites to prevent harmful situations. They are responsible for maintaining the
12 safety of an assigned location. NRA – National Rifle Association.

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14 Section 3: This Bill is an option for schools. There will be no punishment for schools who do not participate.
15 Under existing state laws, schools could be fined for allowing teachers who are not trained to carry
16 concealed weapons.

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18 Section 4: The Kentucky State Police will be in charge of implementing weapon and restraint training. The
19 Board of Education will be in charge of anything as far as designating teachers who qualify for the training.

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21 Section 5: As of now, the Kentucky State Police does not have a course designed for this specific type of
22 training. The program would need to be designed and have funding from outside sources. These sources
23 could include organizations such as the NRA. For teachers to be eligible they would need their concealed
24 weapons permit and training. The cost would be their responsibility. The only cost to the state would be
25 responsible for is the development of the training program and facilities.

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27 Section 6: This bill will take affect the following school year.
