	An act to require nome-schooled students to snow proof of grade level learning.
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3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
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5	Section 1: Home-schooled students of Kentucky will be required to show proof of learning through both
6	portfolios & state testing. Portfolios, which will be assessed through the state-wide writing rubrics, will be
7	required to be submitted for assessment each year except for the years of required testing. The tests will be
8	administered at the end of the following school years: 2nd, 5th, 8th, 10th, & 12th grades. According to the
9	No Child Left Behind Act, every child within the United States should have the opportunity for educational
10	equality.
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12	Section 2: This bill will not only affect home-schooled students, but also the Kentucky Dept. of Education
13	(KDE). It could alter the curriculum for home-schooled students. In addition, KDE will be responsible for
14	administering & assessing these exams & portfolios.
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16	Section 3: Portfolios will be graded using the state-wide rubric. Students must score an apprentice or above
17	on their portfolios. The composite score on state assessments muct be at least appropriate as well. After

Section 3: Portfolios will be graded using the state-wide rubric. Students must score an apprentice or above on their portfolios. The composite score on state assessments must be at least apprentice, as well. After our bill takes effect, home-schooled students & teachers will receive pacing guides that can guide their curriculum. Assessments will be given each year, but the consequences will not be implemented until after the first 5 years. This bill will be funded through federal grants courtesy of the No Child Left Behind Act.

Section 4: Consequences, for not complying or passing the examinations/portfolio evaluations, are they will have to retake the test within three months. If they fail again, they will have to repeat the grade level & have to follow the state-wide pacing guides. Modifications will be made for those students with a documented learning or medical disability.

27 Section 5: This bill will take effect July 1, 2015.
