1 An act to ban vapor cigarettes from public areas with non-smoking regulations.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: Many public areas including restaurants are allowing people to use vapor cigarettes in the non-
6 smoking areas, therefore, this bill requires all public areas to ban the use of vapor cigarettes in non-smoking
7 areas.

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9 Section 2: Failure to abide by the regulation will result in the following penalties:

- 10 Individual First Offense: The offender will receive a verbal warning issued by
11 management or a representative of the facility.
- 12 Individual Second Offense: The offender will receive a written warning and asked to leave the
13 premises.
- 14 Individual Third Offense: The offender will be fined in the amount of \$100 and the offender
15 will be banned from the premises until regulation is followed.

17 Business First Offense: The business will receive a verbal warning from the
18 local police department.
- 19 Business Second Offense: The business will receive a written warning and a fine of \$100 will
20 be issued.
- 21 Business Third Offense: The business will receive a fine of \$500 and be required to submit
22 to unscheduled checks from the local police department to
23 determine if the regulations are being followed.

25 Section 3: This bill will be enforced by managers or supervisors of public facilities and local police officers.
26 The current non-smoking policies are already enforced by the local police department. Local police are paid
27 through local taxes and therefore, this bill does not require additional funding. Any funds collected from this
28 bill will go to non-smoking campaigns for those under age.

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31 Section 4: This bill will go into effect three months after the date of passage.
