4 5 6	Section 1: Every public school must comply with a state issued dress code.
7 8 9	Section 2: The state-wide dress code will require all public schools to abide by the same standard for all grade levels and all counties in the state of Kentucky.
9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16	Section 3: The current administration of each school district would enforce this bill within each individual school. In order to supervise this regulation, a new Inspection Department for the Kentucky Department of Education will be created. The Inspection Department will cost approximately \$18,000. This cost will provide part time positions for inspectors. Inspectors will make two inspections of each school. Any fines or funds collected will go toward funding the new Inspection Department. Otherwise, funds will be taken from local school taxes collected.

First Offense: The student will receive a disciplinary write up for violating the dress code and a call home to have a new outfit brought. If an outfit is unable to be provided by a parent/guardian the student will be sent to the school's in school suspension program.</li> <li>Second Offense: The student will receive a disciplinary write up for violating the dress code for the second time and be sent home.</li> </ul>
24 25 26 27	Third Offense: The student will be suspended from school for two days. Section 5: The Inspection Department will provide the following consequences for schools found in violation of the state-wide dress code.

Second Offense: The school will receive a written documentation of the violation and a \$1000 fine. Third Offense: The school will receive a written documentation of the violation, a \$2500 fine, and the school must submit to random dress code checks from the Inspection Department.
34	Section 5: This bill will go into effect one year after passage.
