1 2	An act to require food stamp recipients to be drug screened annually
3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6 7 8	Section 1: Recipients of food stamps or of a government program congruous to it, be it obligatory for the least amount, be drug tested annually. This will not affect residents receiving benefits from the Social Security Disability Program.
9 10 11	Section 2: The recipients must report to the local health department within 48 hours of receiving notification or the food stamp recipients will be penalized.
12 13 14	Section 3: If drugs are found in the urine, the food stamp revenue will be decreased or halted for a given amount of time.
15 16	Section 4: Food stamp recipients may be drug tested at any given time, more than just annually.
17 18 19	Section 5: The funding for this bill/drug tests will be provided by the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services.
20	Section 6: Offenses for finding drugs in the urine of for neglecting your drug test notice:
21 22 23	First Offense: Receive a 40% cut in welfare benefits for two pay periods.
24 25 26	Second Offense: Receive a 50% cut in welfare benefits for three pay periods and attend drug counseling and/or rehabilitation.
20 27 28	Third Offense: Welfare pay is cut off immediately until a clean drug test is administered.
29	Section 7: Upon passage, this bill will go into effect on May 1, 2015.
