An act to require food labels to disclose that meat or dairy products have been treated with growth hormones or antibiotics that promoted growth.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Farmers discovered many years ago that their livestock would gain 3% more body weight if they were given small amounts of antibiotics on a regular basis. When given to dairy cattle the amount of milk produced per cow increased greatly. This benefited the farmers' income per animal they raised. As with any antibiotic, the more a human consumes the more resistant they become to that antibiotic strand. Farmers are reaping the benefits financially of larger animals but our society is left searching for new cures to common ailments due to overexposure.

Section 2: This bill requires the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to mandate that all food products (meat and/or dairy) must be labeled as "Contains Hormone" or "Contains Antibiotics" so that consumers may make their own purchasing decisions about these products.

Section 3: All food or food products that are commercially sold would be required to be labeled as containing or not containing hormones and/or antibiotics.

Section 4: This bill would go into affect on July 1, 2015. Each packaging plant would simply add this new information to its existing labels. Grocers would not be able to purchase or sell any products that are not properly labeled.
